The effort started with pre-sales after June masses, and meat preparation and smoking on the 2nd of July through the late morning of the 3rd. Our appreciative customers picked up their fully-cooked and wrapped purchases during the afternoon preceding the 4th of July Holiday. In the end, 54 pork butts and 58 racks of ribs were rubbed, smoked, and delivered without complaint, raising over \$1,400. Mississippi District -Assembly # 554 - Flag Retirement

In February 2018, the FN of Assembly 554, Dave Fisher, was approached by Scout Master (SM) Josh Garner, of St. Richard Troop # 30, as to the feasibility of the CC providing instruction in marching, posting of Colors, and proper flag etiquette. The event was unanimously accepted by the membership at the March meeting and a tentative date of May 12th was mutually agreed upon.

As the plan developed, the Assembly felt it would be a good opportunity to perform a flag retirement ceremony as a closing to the flag presentation. He indicated that he already had numerous flags that needed to be retired and the scouts had a ceremonial script in place. Fr. John Bohn, pastor and a vet himself, was contacted for permission to hold the event on church property and he was 100% behind it. The FN and SM agreed that it would be most fitting to hold the event at the STR community 4th of July picnic. We collected in the neighborhood of 30+ flags. The Marshall, Craig Harrell, was given the new date and a request went out for CC support.

The scouts marched about 300 yards to the event site. When they entered the grounds, there were cheers from the 400 or so spectators like these young men never heard before. Fr John said the ceremonial prayers. Taps was played at intervals, 3 times, by Council 15131 volunteer Mike Pawlik. The scouts, in pairs, presented the flags and then handed them off to the fire master. We spent approximately 1 hour and then retired from the field in the same manner that we took it.

The reaction was outstanding. The FN had several vets and other spectators comment on "what took us so long to do this," "are you going to do it next year," and "the picnic needed some patriotic element added to it." A couple emotionally just said "thank you." Fr. John has assured the planning committee he wants this to become a standard part of the picnic.

- Publish and distribute to the Assembly membership a minimum of six Assembly Newsletters during the 2018-2019 fraternal year. A copy of each newsletter must also be sent (either in print or electronically) to the Vice Supreme Master at MJPKNIGHT9282@AOL.COM.
- Meet the Assembly's membership goal with a net gain of 10% additions over deletions.
- Complete and submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728), which is due January 31, 2019.
- Complete and submit to your District Master by April 30, 2019 the "To Be a Patriot Award" application.
- Earn the Civic Award by conducting a minimum of four patriotic programs during the 2018-2019 fraternal year and reporting those programs to the Supreme Master by June 30, 2019 on the "Civic Award" application.
- Complete and submit the "Report of Officers Chosen for the Term" (#186).
