A Word from our 4th Degree Master

Worthy State Officers, District Deputies, Grand Knights, and fellow Knights of the Mississippi Jurisdiction:

Today is Holy Thursday, that day of the Last Supper. In my early days as a child I recall sitting in Church and listening to our parish Priest telling the story of the Last Supper, I recall wondering why Christ Jesus went to the Upper Room and before the entire world, proclaimed His life and Death.

Sacred Heart D'Iberville to Hold Easter Mass

Sacred Heart Church in D'Iberville was devastated, on August 29, 2005, like many other Churches along the Gulf Coast. Have received over eight foot of water in the Church and elementary school, rendered them unusable. But through the overwhelming generosity of the local Baptist and Methodist communities, Fr. Bob Higginbotham was able to hold Saturday and Sunday Masses and even keep the elementary school going. These unprecedented acts of Christianity, by the local Baptist and Methodist Church leaders, has not been publicized enough and deserves one more mention here.

Many other acts of generosity and kindness have allowed the Parishioners of Sacred Heart the opportunity to look forward to Easter Sunday Mass in their own Church. There were the volunteers who reworked the electrical and air conditioning systems, the people who dedicated their time to patch and clean and buff the floors. The Tabernacle is being cleaned and re-worked by (a devout Methodist) the father of GK Roger Fetters, Mr. Rex Fetters. But we still needed one more thing, chairs. So I sent out a plea and boy did you guys respond. I got calls and emails from all over the state. The two closest and most easily accessible, were chairs from the Mississippi Gulf Coast Coliseum and from the National Guard Base in Gulfport. Both of these options were submitted to me from Brother Knights. We took BOTH options (we needed plenty of chairs). All in all, we picked-up and moved close to 800 chairs. It would be nice to see all of them filled on Easter Sunday

Dear Brother Knights:

Seventeen candidates became Sir Knights in the Fourth Degree in Brandon, hosted by the St. Paul Council, 10216, on Saturday, April 8, 2006. The exemplification was performed by the Hank Kajdan Degree Team. Hank Kadjan is the only living Sir Knight who has a Fourth Degree Team named after him.

There were two honorees for the event, both recently returned from Iraq, Colonel Jesse Roy Robinson, and Patrick Kyle Quinn. Honors were noted during the superb dinner cooked and served by the St. Paul Knights, their spouses, and children. Patrick Quinn could not be there.

The Colonel, pictured (to the right) with his spouse and Dr. Paul, spoke about a second war that the spouses and families left behind must endure when a soldier goes off to war. He described with passion the valor those left behind must show and the difficulties they face. He spoke of dropping backpacks, weapons, and armor, and getting down on knees to pray before entering battle, expressing with certainty his belief that those prayers miraculously saved many lives. Finally, the Colonel asked us to "wrap our arms" around those soldiers we see coming home and let them know that we appreciate what they did for us. The Fourth Degree is about patriotism, which is itself a form of charity on a very high level. Sir Knights know their responsibility to serve their country and church, not only in battle, but here at home in ways they never thought

possible, through the programs of the Assembly. If you are not a Sir Knight, take a look; be a part of something really important.
