A WORD FROM OUR STATE DEPUTY

Worthy State Officers, District Deputies, Grand Knights, and fellow Knights of the Mississippi Jurisdiction:

As we near the Christmas Holidays and the New Year, Denise and I want to thank everyone for their support during the past year and wish you and yours a very peaceful and prayerful Christmas. During the Homily at Mass this past weekend, our Pastor, Father Dennis Harlow, reminded us that this is the season to give thanks for all the blessings God has bestowed on us and for us to remember as we go about our busy ways that Christ Jesus loves us always. He also said this is the season of giving, especially to the less fortunate, the aged, and the infirmed. Each of us should take time to reflect upon this season as the birth of Christ was indeed a miracle, one that would be remembered through time and eternity.

We have much to look forward to in 2007 as we have lots of important activities planned in the first 4 months. For us to be successful a successful organization, we must be prepared to effectively lead our membership to participate in each scheduled event or activity, accomplish the necessary reports and forms, and continue to actively recruitment eligible Catholic men to join our Order.

During our State mid-year meeting held 1-2 December in Ocean Springs, the State Officers and I emphasized many important issues such as membership, retention, and paperwork requirements. We stressed once again how important it is for Grand Knights to take advantage of the free or low cost recruitment materials available at Supreme. I urged the District Deputies to ensure adequate supplies of Knights of Columbus literature and recruitment materials are on hand at their local councils.

We also discussed the next membership BLITZ which is planned for February. We have 2 Major Exemplifications scheduled plus some districts have regularly scheduled First Degrees to ensure their new candidates are brought into the Order in a timely manner. You should plan now for your council's new member recruitment drive. You should ensure your council has ordered their recruitment material. If you need outside help, contact your District Deputy, or Martin Bisek, our State Membership Director for assistance.

Grand Knights: Please make sure you and your council complete and submits two important forms. The first being the Annual Fraternal Activities Report due by 31 Jan 07 and the Semi-Annual Audit Report due by 15 Feb 07. I will be asking our District Deputies to monitor the submissions of these forms. Do your part and make sure they are accomplished as required—it is your duty as the Grand Knight.

My Dear Brother Knights,

I sincerely hope you all are at peace in God's love. We are deep in Advent now, and as many of you already know Advent is a word that essential means "to come." The Church season of Advent has two purposes. The first is related to Christ's coming 2000 years ago, His being born at Bethlehem in a stable and laid in a manger. We are preparing ourselves to celebrate our Savior's, first coming. The first arrival of Jesus was initially unnoticed by the world around Him. Then the angels sang the song of glory and told the shepherds in the field of the Messiah. The shepherds then went and did homage to the baby Jesus. (you know this story!)

Secondly we are preparing to celebrate Jesus' coming at the end of time, the Second Coming. In the Second Coming Jesus will be anything but unnoticed. He will come in glory and power. It is with both joy and a certain awareness that we must prepare ourselves to meet Jesus that we get ready for this Second

Coming. Believe it or not – in the midst of an overly commercialized and material extravaganza that "the holiday season" has become, Advent in the Church is a season of repentance, reflection and preparation for the end – the BIG END, not just the end of one year. The third Sunday of Advent is in fact named Gaudete Sunday which is Latin for "rejoice." The Joy is not in gifts or parties or a playoff berth for the New Orleans Saints rather the Joy is in our Salvation. So you Rejoice in the birth of Christ and Rejoice that He is coming again. Rejoice and do good works in thanksgiving to God. I wish you all a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
