- 2. Facilitates the planning, structure and hosting of all Cor gatherings
- 3. Ensures adequate preparation for each *Cor* gathering including reserving space, communicating timing\content and ensuring excellent execution of every event.
- 4. Encouraged to build an EFF team to help with all aspects to support Cor gatherings
- 5. Promotes and communicates directives, opportunities and goals of State Council concerning evangelization and faith formation
- 6. Collaborates and consults these initiatives with:
 - a. The Pastor and/or Council Chaplain
 - b. The Council Membership and Program Directors
 - c. The State Director of EFF
- 7. Assists council leadership with this strategic planning.
- 8. Along with the Grand Knight, the EFF Director should coordinate and communicate with any existing parish ministries, particularly men's ministries in such a way that fosters collaboration and the possibility of a hybrid experience achieving the aims and goals of both groups.


