Catholic Prohibitions Against In-Vitro Fertilization and Various Assisted Reproductive Technologies A Collection of Key Catholic Documents

"The teaching of the Church is founded upon the inseparable connection, willed by God and unable to be broken by man on his own initiative, between the two meanings of the conjugal act: the unitive meaning and the procreative meaning."


Papal Encyclical Humanae Vitae (On the Regulation of Birth), Pope Paul VI, 1968)

God completes His creative act in cooperation with married procreative love through the "one-flesh" union proper only to husband and wife. Cardinal Carlo Caffarra once said, "God celebrates His creative act in the holy temple of conjugal love". Because God's creative act is an act of love, the child deserves, and it is only fitting, that he or she be brought into being through a human love act that is worthy of cooperating with God's creative love.

Just as contraception separates the *unitive* from the *procreative* ends of marriage, In-Vitro Fertilization (IVF) and the various forms of Assisted Reproductive Technologies (e.g., artificial insemination, surrogacy, human cloning) separate the *procreative* from its *unitive* ends. Through IVF, new human life originates outside the sexual joining of the married man and woman in a lab setting under medical supervision. IVF advances a eugenic and abortive mindset. There is a tendency to view the child as a "right" or "product" and not a gift whom God entrusts to the parents' care as a visible and permanent sign of their love. Since more embryos (human persons) are created than needed, the unwanted embryos are aborted or frozen. In fact, a recent *National Catholic Register* article cited Center for Disease Control statistics which claimed IVF causes more than double the number of abortions than directly-procured abortions.

In his January 2025 Pastoral Letter titled "The Christian Family, In Vitro Fertilization, and Heroic Witness to True Love" (see next page for link), Arlington VA Diocese Bishop Michael Burbridge cited a recent and disturbing Pew survey that stated 65% of American Catholics view IVF access as a 'good'. We hope that our membership will use the resources in the following pages to educate themselves, their families and others and reduce that percentage.
