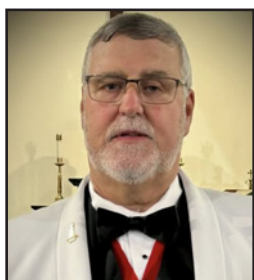

From the State Membership Director

Many of the District Deputies attended the State Organizational Meeting on the weekend of December 6, and brought back some meaningful information on the condition of the Jurisdiction to their councils. Two goals were presented:

* The immediate goal was to achieve 50% membership by December 31, 2025. We are currently at approximately 40.2%. In order to achieve our 50% we need a minimum of 36 new members to sign up through the E-Membership app.

* The long-term goal is to achieve the Circle of Honor {COH}. The Jurisdiction hasn't earned this status in 3 administrations. Obviously, we need to attain 100% membership, 206 new members.

As you can see, we have a lot of work to do to accomplish this percentage. If we lose ground in 2025, it is added to the 2026 number. As a workmate once said at a program review meeting: "Gentlemen, we are dancing in the mud." With our experiences with Yazoo clay, no explanation is needed.

We do have a small life-line: the Pending Application report contains the names of 23 candidates who had filled out the application but had not responded to Supreme's confirmation email. District 15 has sent emails to Supreme on 2 candidates, and Districts 7 and 2 are aggressively searching out additional candidates.

Where the Membership Outreach program (church drive) has been utilized, it has been successful. Granted we're not seeing numbers in the double digits like other states, but we're not other states. It's showing effort and that's all one can ask. What about asking the Pastor if you could have a few minutes after Mass to talk K of C programs? Have each Program Chairman briefly discuss

his program and a few positive impacts that come from it.

The Constitution requires bringing in at least two new members per year, one in October and one in March. That's a minimum, so ideally you should be doing one per quarter. Programs are a great way to gain recruits, seeing the council in action. Do you have your best "socializer" mixing with the crowd, or do you just set up a table and watch young men walk by? They probably think you're selling cards.

Finally, how many councils have a functioning Membership Chairman? Not just on paper, but truly dedicated to the job. Do you Grand Knights give him time in the meeting, or, do you accept "no report"? Do you District Deputies get in the mix and help guide council membership chairs?

When we joined the Order, we all signed up for the job of recruiting, even the State Officers. The direction now is that any member with the word **State** in his title is charged to get one new member - and if one, then why not two!

Brothers, I feel deeply about the Order, and the Mississippi Jurisdiction. I know the vast majority of you feel the same way. We're all frustrated. But, I'm here to tell you, we are not alone in this quest. Our Supreme Regional Growth Director is available for anything help we may need. I talk to him frequently and he is our biggest cheerleader at Supreme. Without a doubt our SD Kenny Gonzales will turn boulders to get us help.

I'm not the Grinch, and I do believe in Santa, the Easter Bunny and the Tooth Fairy. So please have a very, very happy, holy, and safe Christmas and New Year. Do your best plus one.

2. Facilitates the planning, structure and hosting of all *Cor* gatherings
3. Ensures adequate preparation for each *Cor* gathering including reserving space, communicating timing\content and ensuring excellent execution of every event.
4. Encouraged to build an EFF team to help with all aspects to support *Cor* gatherings
5. Promotes and communicates directives, opportunities and goals of State Council concerning evangelization and faith formation
6. Collaborates and consults these initiatives with:
 - a. The Pastor and/or Council Chaplain
 - b. The Council Membership and Program Directors
 - c. The State Director of EFF
7. Assists council leadership with this strategic planning.
8. Along with the Grand Knight, the CEFF Director should coordinate and communicate with any existing parish ministries, particularly men's ministries in such a way that fosters collaboration and the possibility of a hybrid experience achieving the aims and goals of both groups.
